REDUNDANT EMERGENCY POWER - OPERATIONS & COMMAND CENTER CONTINUITY

A community service commitment to protect public health and safety and to preserve community spaces that support emergency response and resilience.



FUNDING REQUEST: \$500,000

OVERVIEW OF NEED:

Pass Area Recreation and Park District is seeking funding to install redundant emergency power systems to support operations and command center functions at Noble Creek Regional Park.

During wildfire incidents and power shutoffs, emergency briefings, mapping, communications, and coordination activities were disrupted due to loss of power.

This project will provide reliable redundant power to maintain command center operations during outages, ensuring continuity of emergency coordination and decision-making.

Pass Area Recreation & Park District provides parks, recreation facilities, and community programs serving the City of Beaumont and the Cherry Valley area. In addition to recreation services, the District supports regional emergency response operations, particularly during wildfire incidents. NOBLE CREEK REGIONAL PARK SPORTS FIELD LIGHTING UPGRADES (EMERGENCY OPERATIONS LIGHTING)

A community service commitment to protect public health and safety and to preserve community spaces that support emergency response and resilience.



FUNDING REQUEST: \$3,000,000

OVERVIEW OF NEED:

Pass Area Recreation & Park District is seeking state funding to upgrade sports field lighting at Noble Creek Regional Park to support nighttime emergency operations and wildfire response.

Noble Creek Regional Park is routinely used as a staging and support location during wildfire incidents, including fire camps, logistics operations, and emergency coordination; however, recent wildfire events and power shutoffs disrupted emergency staging and lighting, limiting the site's ability to safely support nighttime operations.

Upgraded, high-capacity sports field lighting will ensure the park can reliably function as an emergency staging and logistics hub during disasters, improving operational effectiveness and first responder safety.

BACKUP POWER & AUTOMATIC TRANSFER SWITCH / SWITCHGEAR – SPORTS FIELD LIGHTING & SUPPORT INFRASTRUCTURE

A community service commitment to protect public health and safety and to preserve community spaces that support emergency response and resilience.



FUNDING REQUEST: \$500,000

OVERVIEW OF NEED:

Pass Area Recreation and Park District is seeking funding to install backup power systems and automatic transfer switch/switchgear to support sports field lighting and related infrastructure at Noble Creek Regional Park.

During recent wildfire-related power shutoffs, loss of grid power prevented lighting and support infrastructure from operating, limiting the park's ability to function as an emergency staging and logistics site.

This project will provide reliable backup power and automatic transfer capability so that critical lighting and support systems remain operational during outages, ensuring continuity of emergency response operations.

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COMMUNITY BENEFITS

Ensuring Continuous Emergency Operations –

- **Maintains lighting and infrastructure during power outages.**

Improving Disaster Resilience –

- **Reduces vulnerability to wildfire-related power shutoffs.**

Supporting First Responder Effectiveness –

- **Keeps staging areas functional during emergencies.**

COMMAND CENTER COMMUNICATIONS & RV SUPPORT INFRASTRUCTURE UPGRADES

A community service commitment to protect public health and safety and to preserve community spaces that support emergency response and resilience.



FUNDING REQUEST: \$2,000,000

OVERVIEW OF NEED:

Pass Area Recreation and Park District is seeking funding to modernize communications and supporting infrastructure at Noble Creek Regional Park to better serve emergency operations and mobile command units.

Existing communications backbone systems, electrical capacity, and hardscape areas are insufficient to support today's emergency response needs.

This project will upgrade communications infrastructure, expand electrical capacity, and improve hardscape to accommodate mobile command vehicles and responder deployments.

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COMMUNITY BENEFITS

Upgrading Emergency Communications -

- Improves coordination and situational awareness.

Supporting Mobile Command Operations -

- Enhances infrastructure for emergency vehicles and staff.

Strengthening Regional Resilience -

- Expands emergency response capacity.
