Subject: Approval of Fall 2026 Season

Recommendations:

Staff recommends that the Board of Directors approve the 2026 Fall Baseball and Softball Development Program, including the proposed Select Program, registration fees, season format, schedule and program structure.

Background and Analysis:

The Pass Area Youth Baseball & Softball (PAYBS) Fall Development Program is designed to provide a structured, instructional environment focused on player development, skill refinement, and continued participation following the spring recreational season. Unlike the traditional spring season, the fall program emphasizes player growth through instructional clinics, limited game play, and increased opportunities for skill development while preparing players for future recreational and Select competition.

Registration is set to open by August 3, 2026. Registration will remain open through September 14, 2026, with all participants registering through TeamSideline our new online registration platform. The season will run from September 14th through November 20, 2026.

Program Structure

The Fall Development Program will offer the following divisions:

Baseball: Shetland, Pinto, Mustang, Bronco, Pony, Colt/Palomino

Softball: 6U, 8U, 10U, 12U, 16U

The registration fee will be \$90 per participant and includes league participation, instructional clinics, development games, a Dri-Fit performance shirt, league hat, and all administrative costs.

During the first three weeks of the season, participants will attend instructional clinics on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays, with development games held each Wednesday. Games will vary depending on age, the time limit per age is to maximize instruction while providing game experience. These first three weeks will also serve as the evaluation period for players and coaches interested in participating in the PAYBS Select program.

Following the evaluation period, Weeks 4 through 10 will consist of one weekly practice and one weekly scrimmage game for all participants remaining in the Fall Development Program. Junior

umpires in training will continue officiating games under staff supervision, providing valuable experience while supporting the District's umpire development initiative.

Uniform Vendor Demonstration

As staff continues to evaluate long-term uniform options for PAYBS and District athletic programming, a uniform vendor demonstration has been scheduled for Tuesday, August 4, 2026, from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at the Noble Creek Clubhouse. Several local uniform vendors have been invited to showcase their products, customization capabilities, pricing structures, and turnaround times. This demonstration will provide staff and up to two Board Members interested with an opportunity to compare available options and identify vendors that best meet the District's goals for quality, customer service, affordability, and consistency across youth sports programs.

Snack Bar Operations

To further support the financial sustainability of the PAYBS program, the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Recreation and Park District will operate the Noble Creek East snack bar throughout the Fall Development Season. Revenue generated from concession sales will be used to help offset league-related operational expenses, including field maintenance, equipment purchases, program improvements, and other costs associated with administering youth baseball and softball programs.

Over the past two tournament weekends, District staff successfully operated the snack bar, and the results have demonstrated that District-managed concessions can provide a reliable and profitable source of supplemental revenue while delivering quality service to participants and spectators. Based on this success, staff believes continuing District-operated snack bar services during the fall season will enhance the participant experience while generating additional funds that can be reinvested directly into PAYBS programming.

Operating the snack bar in-house also allows the District to maintain greater oversight of inventory, food safety, customer service, and financial accountability. Staff will continue evaluating concession operations throughout the season and identify additional opportunities to improve efficiency, increase revenue, and support future youth sports programming.

Select Program

After meeting with interested parents and coaches, staff is proposing the implementation of a PAYBS Select Program for Fall, 2026. This will allow PAYBS to provide an additional competitive opportunity for players seeking a higher level of baseball or softball while remaining within a District-operated program.

Participation in the Select program requires enrollment in the Fall Development program. Players who participated in the 2026 PAYBS Spring season may be placed on predetermined Select teams, while players who did not participate during the spring season must earn placement through the evaluation process conducted during the first three weeks of clinics and development games. Final scrimmage games at the conclusion of the evaluation period will serve as the official team selection day. 2 scrimmage Select tryout scrimmages will be held on Oct 1st and 2nd to help with the final selection process.

Players selected to a Select team will pay an additional \$60 Select program fee. This fee includes an official Select jersey, Select hat, participation in team practices.

Following the initial three-week evaluation period, Select teams will practice and compete in the Moreno Valley Select League for the remaining seven weeks of the season while continuing player development in a more competitive environment. Clinics, sandlot games, and development games during the evaluation period will allow coaches to assess players in game-like situations while providing every participant a fair opportunity to earn placement.

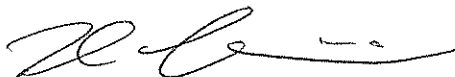
District-sponsored Select teams will receive practice field priority. Once District programming has been scheduled, remaining field availability will be made available to non-PAYBS organizations through the District's standard field reservation process.

Any fundraising conducted by Select teams must comply with District policies. All funds raised on behalf of District-sponsored teams shall be reported to the Beaumont-Cherry Valley Recreation and Park District to ensure financial transparency and accountability.

Fiscal Impact:

The \$90 Fall Development Program registration fee will offset program expenses including field preparation, equipment, uniforms, TeamSideline registration services, administration, insurance, and the Junior Umpire Development Program. The additional \$60 Select Program fee will offset the costs associated with Select uniforms, and other Select program expenses. Program costs will be supported through participant registration revenue and Athletics Division budgeted funds.

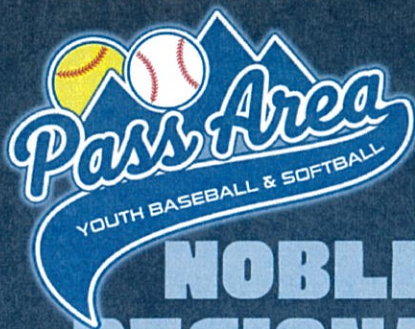

Subject: Approval of the PAYBS Volunteer Committee Structure

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the Board of Directors approve the establishment of the Pass Area Youth Baseball and Softball (PAYBS) Volunteer Committee Structure and authorize staff to recruit and appoint volunteers to the committees as needed to support league operations.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS:

Following the successful inaugural 2026 Spring Season of Pass Area Youth Baseball and Softball (PAYBS), staff have evaluated opportunities to increase volunteer involvement and improve league operations. To continue building a sustainable and community-driven program, staff are proposing the creation of volunteer committees that allow parents, coaches, and community members to contribute their skills and interests in meaningful ways.

Volunteers will have the opportunity to sign up for the committee(s) that best match their experience, interests, and availability. Committee members will work collaboratively with District staff to provide recommendations, assist with planning and implementation, and support the overall success of the PAYBS leagues offered.

The proposed volunteer committees include:

- Uniforms & Equipment
- Grievances
- Evaluations
- Events/Facilities (Pancake Breakfast, Park Clean-Up Day, Opening Day, Closing Day)
- Fundraising & Sponsorships
- Volunteer & Team Parent
- Rules & Safety
 - Baseball
 - Softball
- All-Stars, Select & Tournaments

Establishing these committees will encourage greater community participation, distribute volunteer responsibilities more effectively, and create opportunities for families to become actively involved in the continued growth of PAYBS. While these committees will provide valuable input and assistance, all final operational decisions will remain under the authority of District staff to ensure consistency, compliance with District policies, and effective administration of the program.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The potential costs associated with the volunteer committees are for a volunteer shirt and those costs will be absorbed in the approved 26/27 District budget for PAYBS.
