RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Board of Directors:

1. Authorize expenditures not to exceed \$6,000 to cover lane fees, prizes, and event-related supplies.
2. Approve a minimum registration fee of \$50 per bowler to ensure cost recovery and potential fundraising for future recreation programs.

This event represents a positive step toward community engagement, recreation, and financial sustainability.

BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS:

The Beaumont-Cherry Valley Recreation and Park Improvement Corporation (BCVRPIC) is planning to host its second Bowling Tournament of 2026. This event is intended to provide a fun and competitive recreational opportunity for the community while also serving as a potential fundraiser through various raffles and game-related pots. The event date is Saturday, July 11, 2026, from 11:00 AM to 3:00 PM at Empire Bowl in Redlands, CA. The bowling tournament will utilize up to 24 lanes, with 4 bowlers per lane. The cost is \$25 per bowler, which includes lane time, shoe rental, and bowling ball usage. The total maximum cost for lane fees is \$2,400 (24 lanes x 4 bowlers x \$25).

Additional components for possible fundraising of the event will include:

- 50/50 Raffle
- Basket Raffle
- Reserve Raffle
- Side Pots for Bowlers

These additional activities are designed to enhance the experience, generate additional excitement, and raise funds for the Foundation programming.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The maximum estimated cost for the event is \$6,000, which includes:

- Lane rental and participant fees
- Prizes, swag bags, raffle supplies, tickets, decorations, and event materials
- Lunch for bowlers

While revenue may be generated through raffles and side games, the Foundation is requesting authorization to exceed \$6,000 in expenditures to ensure full coverage of event-related costs and contingencies.

Revenue Generation:

To offset costs and support fundraising goals, the Foundation will charge a minimum registration fee of \$50 per bowler. With 96 participants (24 lanes x 4 bowlers), this would generate approximately \$4,800 in revenue, not including proceeds from raffles, side pots, or additional games.

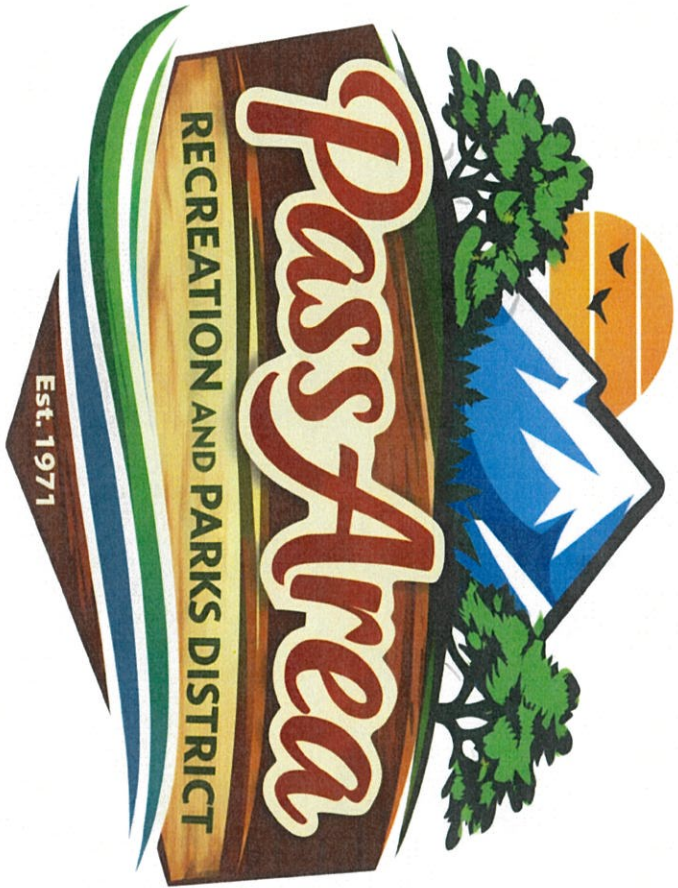
